Goulburn volunteer Jenny was asked to modify clothing for a resident who was experiencing challenges with dressing due to a loss of mobility. Jenny adapted all the resident's clothing to include split backs, making them much more comfortable and accessible. The resident was very happy with the results.

Word spread about Jenny's amazing handiwork, and she has since modified another resident's wardrobe, generously purchasing all the materials herself and completing the work outside her regular volunteering hours.

This is a wonderful example of how the skills and talents of our volunteers can address specific needs within our care homes.
