### **Know Me Program**



The Know Me Dementia Program – Phase 2 commenced in early February, welcoming **15 new volunteers** who are being trained in reminiscence therapy and capturing residents' life stories. This **16 week program** focuses on creating digital life story videos, which will be used by staff and treating medical practitioners to provide person-centred care by truly understanding the person behind the dementia.

At the completion of the program, these volunteers will continue to contribute by supporting various roles and activities within the Lifestyle Teams.

A collaboration between ANU and Warrigal, this program was a huge success in Phase 1 in 2024, demonstrating the power of storytelling and connection in dementia care. Due to its positive impact, Phase 3 is set to commence in mid 2025, continuing Warrigal's commitment to innovative and compassionate dementia support.

## A World Where Older People Are Loved, Known, and Connected



Loneliness is a growing epidemic among older Australians, with one in three people aged 65 and over experiencing isolation. The health consequences of this social disconnect - ranging from depression and anxiety to chronic disease are profound. As leaders in aged care, we must ask ourselves: How can we address this pressing challenge?

In her recent op-ed, **Warrigal CEO**, **Jenni Hutchins**, explores the urgent need for a paradigm shift in how we an for and engage with older people. She highlights the importance of meaningful community connections and how a person-centred approach in aged care is key to tackling isolation.

Here are some key insights from Jenni's article:

- Loneliness contributes to serious mental and physical health challenges, with long-term effects that go beyond emotional well-being.
- More than 80% of older Australians prefer to receive care in their own homes, making community support and independence crucial to their quality of life.
- Small acts make a big impact: From regular check-ins to creating spaces for intergenerational interactions, even simple acts of kindness can make a world of difference in combating loneliness.

## **A Word From The Artist**



As an Aboriginal man, art has always been something that kept me out of trouble. I grew up in a housing commission area and loved art —it was something I felt I had to do. I never really knew what I wanted to be, but my art teacher at school saw potential in me and encouraged me to pursue it.

For this mural, I wanted to incorporate Warrigal's corporate colours and include the whale, which is the totem of the Dharawal people, symbolising their deep connection to coastal environments. The design represents the whale's migration along the East Coast travelling south and then returning north symbolising movement and connection. It also reflects the journey of residents and their families as they navigate life at Shell Cove.

I aimed to create something aesthetically pleasing, a mural that offers a sense of peace and safety when in the courtyard. I hope the residents, their families, and the community enjoy it for many years to come.
